

November 1 Discussion Questions "A Flourishing Church" Acts 2:42-47

Preview

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42

MAIN IDEA: God has called our church to be a **flourishing** Christian community.

Three characteristics of a flourishing Christian community:

- 1. A **devoted** community (v.42-43)
 - a. To the **teaching** of God's Word
 - b. To the **fellowship**
 - c. To the breaking of **bread**
 - d. To **praying** together
- 2. A <u>unified</u> community (v.44-45)
- 3. A **growing** community (v.46-47)

- 6. How would you define "fellowship?" How is it different from "hanging out with a friend?"
- 7. What are the benefits of praying with other believers? How has praying with others blessed you in times past?
- 8. In what ways was the church unified in v.44-46? What surprises you? What confuses you? What challenges you?
- 9. How do you make sense of the way the early church grew so rapidly? What lessons, if any, can we learn for the church today?

- 10. How might God use the church to deepen your personal relationship with Jesus? What step might He be calling you to take to see this through?
- 11. Which of the four things listed in v.42 might God be calling you to devote yourself more to? How would that bless others and you?
- 12. What are you thankful for at Oakwood? What would you like to see God develop most at Oakwood?
