Love (9/8/24) Discussion Questions

Summary: Jesus has commanded us to love one another so that we may bear fruit and abide in Christ. This fruit is both internal and external. This Sunday we focused on the external: the fruit of ministry impact in the world. Be reminded how we have been loved by the fruit of Christ's ministry in our lives, and how we are called to produce fruit through our love for a world in need of Christ's love!

- One Central Command
 - We are commanded to **love** one another (v. 12, 14, 17)
 - Jesus' command serves a **purpose** (Exodus 19:5; Romans 5:19)
 - Jesus' command and our obedience serve as a **trellis** for our vine to produce abiding **fruit** (1 John 5:3)
- Two Applications
 - How have we been loved? (Christ's example of love)
 - Jesus loved us through his **sacrifice** (v. 13)
 - Jesus loved us through his **fellowship** (vv. 14-15)
 - Jesus loved us through his **commissioning** (v. 16)
 - How are we supposed to love?
 - Love in **sacrifice** (v. 13)
 - Love in **encouragement** (v. 15)
 - Love in **exhortation** (v. 16)

Dig In: Read John 15:12-17

- 6. How has Jesus loved us? What does His love look like?
- 7. What kind of external fruit is Jesus looking for in His followers?
