

# The Lamb (3/23/25)

## Discussion Questions

**Summary:** The whole book of Revelation is the unveiling of the infinite glory of King Jesus. In chapter four we glimpse the worship of God around His glorious throne in heaven. In chapter five we see a slaughtered lamb *standing* before God's throne, receiving the same glory, honor and praise as the One on the throne. This worship scene shows us three aspects of the glory of Jesus: the Lion of Judah, the Root of David and the Lamb that was slain for us. Come worship the One who is most worthy of our praise!

*"Weep no more; behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals."* Revelation 5:5

### The Glory of Jesus Revealed:

1. The Lion of Judah (v. 1-5)
  - The **Faithful** Son of God conquered **Sin** (Gen. 48:8-10)
2. The Root of David (v. 5, 10)
  - The **Victorious** King of kings conquered **Evil** (2 Sam. 7:11-13; Is. 11:1-5)
3. The Lamb slain for us (v. 6-14)
  - The **Sacrifice** that saves sinners conquered **Death** (Ex. 12:7-13)

*"Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing."* Revelation 5:12

1. What is the most special letter you've ever received? What makes it special to you?
2. How would you have felt if for some reason you were not able to open that letter?

### Dig Deeper:

3. Read Revelation 5:1-14. What stands out to you in this passage?
4. Describe the progression in worship through chapters four and five.
5. What do the titles "Lion of Judah" and "Root of David" mean? (Gen. 48:8-10; Is. 11:1-5)
6. Why do you think Jesus appears not as a lion but as a lamb?
7. How did Jesus defeat our enemies? What enemies did he defeat?

### Move Forward:

8. Describe the worship songs being sung in heaven. (vv. 9-10, 12-13)
9. What are you most thankful for and most amazed by in Jesus?
10. Take some time to pray together giving thanks and praise to the Lion and the Lamb, our Lord Jesus Christ!
